Celebrating the Beauty and Mystery of Bogs with Art

- **Show Dates: June 17 – July 23, 2023**
- **Submit entries for consideration via email with photos of art: May 17 – June 11**
- **Notification of Acceptance: June 1 – 11**
- **Delivery of Artwork: June 1 – 11 (but not June 5, 6) between 9 am – 3 pm**

Each artist may contribute three bog items including two already shown in prior BIA shows.

The goal of Bogs in Art is to encourage artists to learn about bogs around the world, and share their beauty, mystery, and culture through art. Artists also have the option of offering their works for sale to support Volo Bog State Natural Area through Friends of Volo Bog.

Any Medium Goes!

All items must be original works of the artist. Works must be delivered in person. No electronic submissions.

Space is limited – phone ahead (815-344-1294) to reserve space and arrange delivery time.

So, what is a bog? Bogs are peatlands that receive primarily meteoric or 'sky water' – rain and snow. They are found all around the world and especially in cooler climates of high latitudes, both in the northern and southern hemispheres, and at high elevations. Their stagnant, low oxygen water becomes acidic due to the presence of sphagnum moss and other plants like tamarack and black spruce. The low oxygen and high acidity limit decomposition causing peat to accumulate. When sequestered in a bog, peat does not release its nutrients, rendering bog soil rather stingy and sterile. These tough conditions limit the plants that can grow in bogs.

Peatland cultures & climate People have used peat sod to build homes and heat them, and more recently, as fuel in power plants. Bodies preserved in peat for over 2,000 years have been unearthed in peatland excavations in northern Europe. Peatlands comprise only 3% of earth's land coverage, yet trap over 30% of our planet's soil carbon, thus making them critical in mitigating climate change.

Get Creative – Maybe incorporate a bit of bog culture (perhaps a bog body or a sod hut, peat cutters or even a power plant?) as well as natural history, keeping true to our ONE RULE. As you contemplate the piece(s) you will create, keep in mind the meaning of 'depict' and 'represent.' One need not create a precise rendition. For example, a tapestry made of brown to represent peat, green for sphagnum moss, pink for orchids and red for cranberries. It is all in how you *tell the story* and demonstrate your understanding of a bog.

At least one bog plant (from first list below) must be depicted or represented in your work(s).

Works that do not include at least one of the above will not be accepted in Bogs in Art.

Bogs share plant species with other ecosystems so you may also include one or more of the following:
